WHEREAS, the the United States Department of Housing & Urban Development, is being petitioned for the issuance of funds to the Neighborhood Development; and

WHEREAS, the funds in the amount of THREE MILLION EIGHTY-NINE THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN DOLLARS (**\$3,089,167.00**) would fund rental assistance and supportive services for persons with HIV/AIDS. Therefore be it
