AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND Federal FY25 Title III-B Supportive Services FUNDS, AWARDED BY U.S. Department of Health and Human Services AND MA Executive Office of Elder Affairs.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and MA Executive Office of Elder Affairs, are being petitioned for the issuance of funds to the Age Strong Commission; and

WHEREAS, the funds in the amount of ONE MILLION THIRTY-EIGHT THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FORTY-THREE DOLLARS (**\$1,038,243.00**) would fund home-based support services for older adults in the City of Boston. Therefore be it
