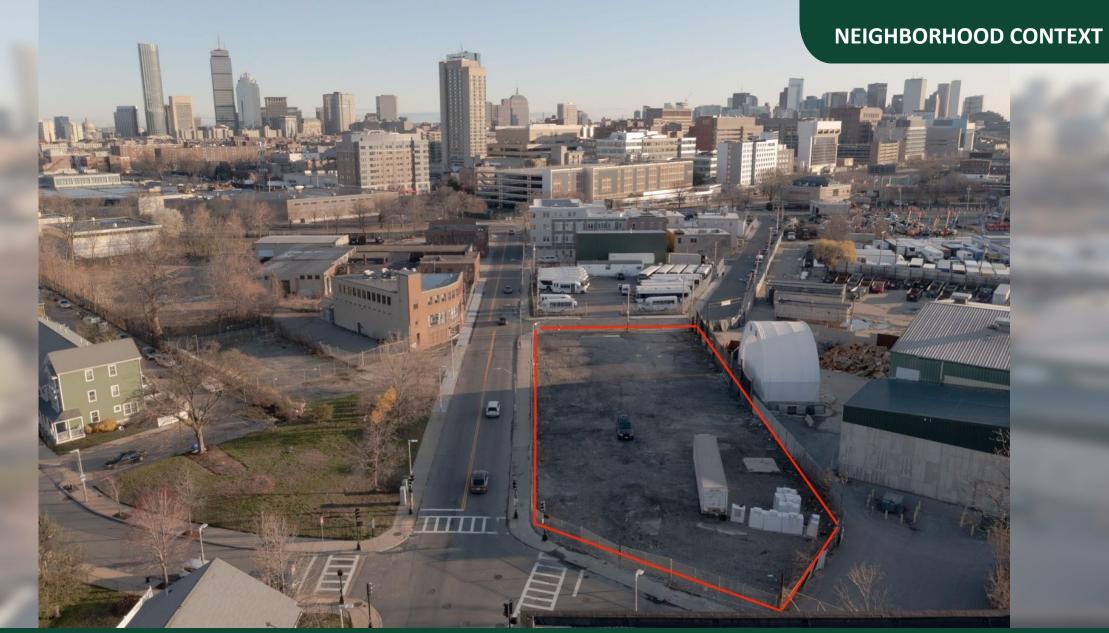


### RETAIL RECREATIONAL DISPENSARY

- The proposed Cannabis Retail has received approval from the BDPA and the ZBA.
  - Green Line Boston, Inc. holds provisional licenses for cultivation and manufacturing facilities also to be sited at 100-114 Hampden St.
- On August 6, 2024, a Community Outreach Meeting was held on-site at 100-114 Hampden Street with the assistance of the Office of Neighborhood Services.
- The applicant now seeks approval from the Boston Cannabis Board.
- Following approval from the Boston Cannabis Board, Green Line Boston, Inc. will apply for a marijuana retailer license from the Cannabis Control Commission.
- Upon final licensure of the Cannabis Retail from the Cannabis Control Commission, Green Line Boston will break ground and begin build-out of the project.

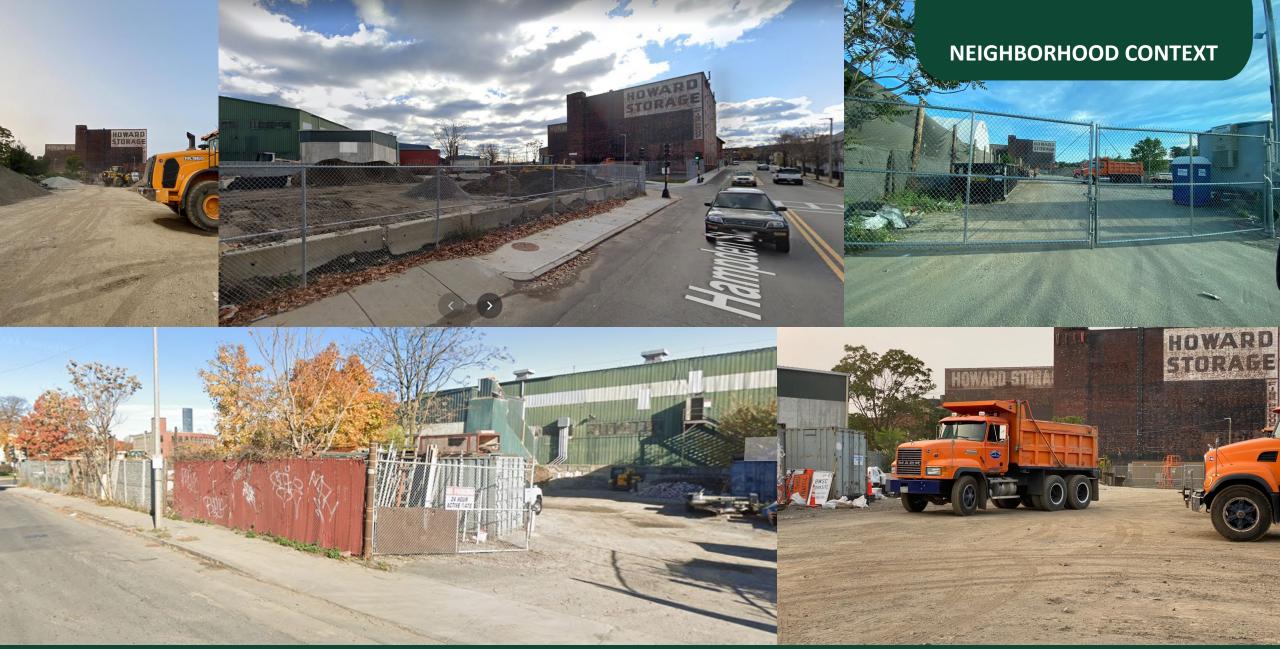


























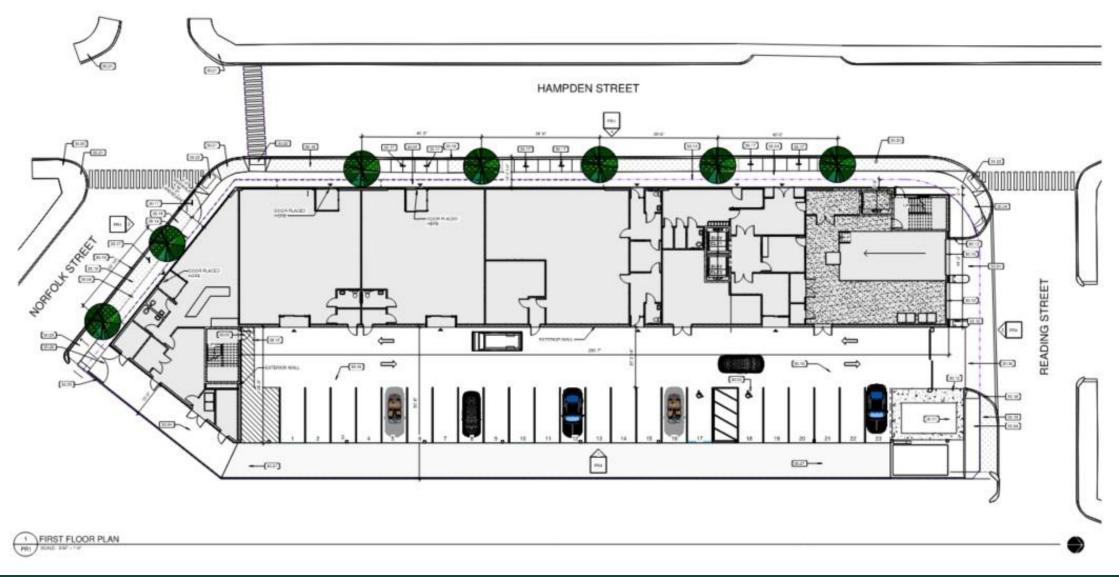






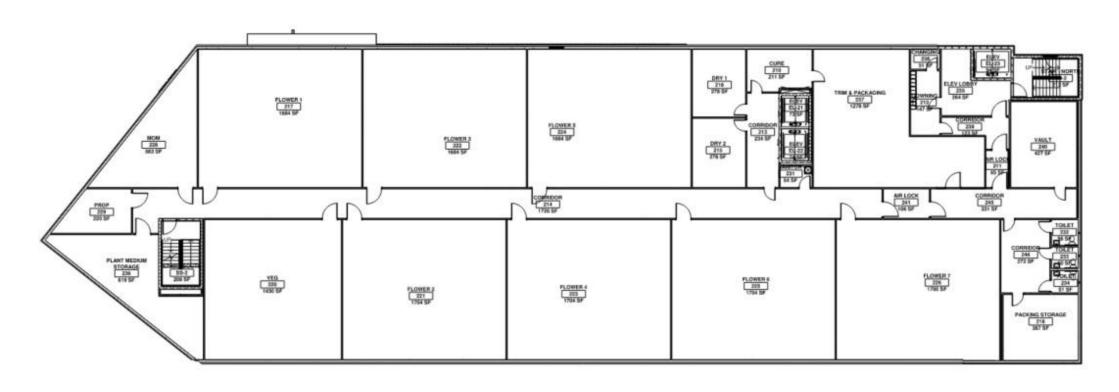

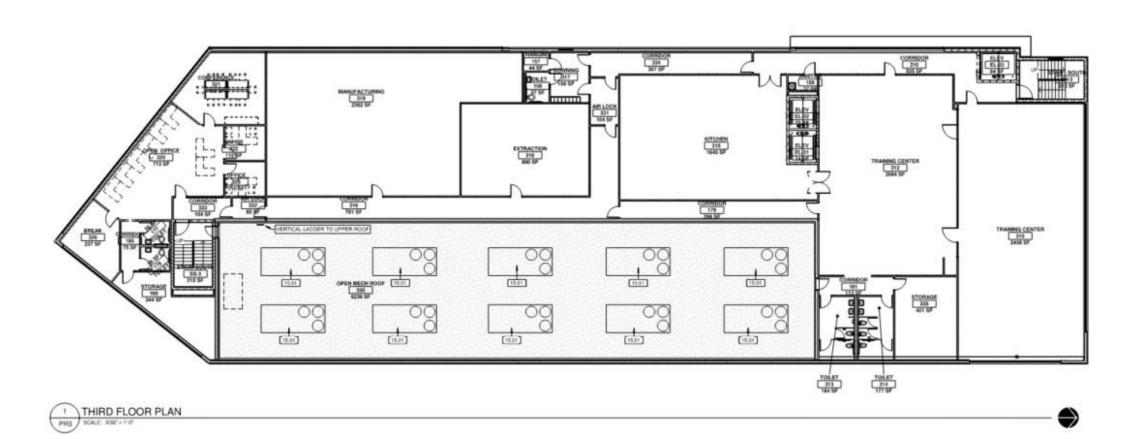
















### **Retail Sales**

- Only adult use consumers 21 years of age or older with a valid, government-issued photo ID will be allowed to enter the retail dispensary and purchase marijuana
- Odor control and waste disposal will be in accordance with industry best practices, Commission Regulations, and City of Boston regulations.
- All marijuana and marijuana products will be sold in plain, resealable, and tamper or child-resistant packaging that is labeled in compliance with all applicable rules and regulations.

- No products inside the facility will be visible from the exterior of the facility
- Green Line Boston, Inc. will not sell more than one (1) ounce of marijuana flower or 5 grams of concentrate to an adult-use consumer per day
- No marijuana products available for sale will contain nicotine or alcohol
- Educational materials will be available on a range of topics, which will include side effects, strains and methods of administration, dosage, and substance abuse



### **Preventing Diversion**

- Green Line Boston, Inc. will institute a policy for the immediate dismissal of any Marijuana Establishment Agent who has diverted Marijuana, which shall be reported to Law Enforcement Authorities and to the Commission.
- Green Line Boston, Inc. will not engage in any marketing, advertising, or branding practices that are targeted to, deemed to appeal to, or portray minors under 21 years of age.
- Green Line Boston, Inc. will not hire any individuals who are under the age of 21 or who have been convicted of distribution of controlled substances to minors.

- Green Line Boston, Inc. will not manufacture or sell any edible products that resemble a realistic or fictional human, animal, or fruit, including artistic, caricature, or cartoon renderings.
- Any marketing, advertising, and branding materials for public viewing will include, inter alia, a warning stating, "For use only by adults 21 years of age or older. Keep out of the reach of children."
- Green Line Boston, Inc.'s website will require all online visitors to verify they are 21 years of age or older prior to accessing the website.
- All visitors to the facility must be 21 years of age or older



### Preventing Nuisance

Our success as a cannabis operator is predicated upon our commitment to work with the surrounding community in such a way that we are viewed and operate as good business neighbors. Video and live surveillance will be made available to law enforcement officers and the Commission. Furthermore, video and live surveillance will be maintained to ensure that the establishment does not create nuisance conditions in the parking area, sidewalk, street, and area surrounding the premises and adjacent properties. No cannabis or cannabis products will be visible from the exterior of the site.

The following behaviors will not be permitted on site:

- Any disturbance of the peace
- Public consumption of cannabis
- Illegal drug activity under state or local law
- Littering
- Loitering or pedestrian / vehicular traffic
- Illegal parking or violations of state and local traffic laws
- Queuing of patrons or other obstructions of the public or private way

Green Line Boston, Inc. will work diligently and in good faith with the City of Boston to address any nuisance concerns brought to its attention by members of the community.





### **Public Transit Locations**

Our facility is located within walking distance to 9 different buses, shuttles, two commuter rails and the Red Line.

We will have onsite parking for up to 23 employee cars

It's proximity to other public transportation is as follows:

- .2 miles or 4 minute walk from Mass Ave #1 Bus Stop
- .2 miles or 4 minute walk from Albany St. #1, #47 Bus Stop

- .7 miles or 5 minute shuttle to Nubian Station and #14, #15, #19, #23, #28 Bus Stop
- 1 mile or 6 minute shuttle to Andrews Station and #9, #10, #16 bus
