The Boston Transportation Department (BTD) is promulgating new <u>City of Boston Traffic Rules and Regulations on March 1, 2025</u>. Both the current and new Traffic Rules and Regulations can be found on the <u>City of Boston Transportation Department website</u>. The new Traffic Rules and Regulations are also available to view at the City Clerk's Office at Boston City Hall.

Many of the proposed changes reflect administrative revisions required by Federal, State and City laws, regulations and ordinances however the revised Traffic Rules and Regulations will also incorporate policy changes the City has already implemented or plans to implement in the future.

With the exception of the new violation fines and late penalty fees associated with the proposed electric vehicle Traffic Rules and Regulations, we are <u>not</u> proposing to increase or introduce new fines or fees as detailed in Boston Municipal Code, Chapter VI General Services, <u>Section 6-6 Office of the Parking Clerk</u>, sub-section 6-6.3 Schedule of Fines.

The City of Boston Traffic Rules and Regulations were adopted under the authority granted by <u>Chapter 263 of the Acts and Resolves of the Massachusetts Legislature (the "Acts") of 1929</u>, as amended, including, but not limited to the amendments made under <u>Chapter 608 of the Acts of 1986</u>, <u>Code of Massachusetts Regulations including Title 540</u>, <u>Chapter CMR 2.00: the Massachusetts Motor Vehicle Regulations</u>, and the Boston Municipal Code, including but not limited to <u>Section 6-6 Office of the Parking Clerk</u>, and <u>Section 7-7 Transportation Department</u>, as amended, and other applicable laws.
