

COPLEY SQUARE PARK CONSTRUCTION UPDATE FEBRUARY, 2025

Thank you for your patience and continued interest in this project.

Copley Square Park is an important cultural center of our city, and we understand that having the park closed for the duration of construction is difficult for many. We appreciate your patience during our renovation.

You may have noticed that we have encountered a series of storms and very cold temperatures in January and February, which have significantly impacted the work we had planned. We had anticipated something similar to the last few years – one real snow storm and milder temperatures. This has been a real winter! Currently, we are completely frozen out of the NW corner (by the kiosk) with the ground frozen to 1' depth and several inches of ice and snow on top.

We will open the Plaza and Raised Grove as soon as the weather allows us to do this. Fountain, lawn areas, and street sidewalks shall be completed after the Marathon in 2025.

CONSTRUCTION SINCE JANUARY:

- The fountain: Our consultant reviewed all interior areas of the vault, and has signed off, saying everything looks good.
- Sidewalk work has begun on our new Dartmouth Street entrance. We are hoping the weather will allow concrete work to happen for the west half of Boylston sidewalk, so that this part can be completed before April 2025.
- We had some minor issues with custom benches; the manufacturer has addressed some minor modifications to make sure everything fits smoothly.

Work to anticipate in the coming weeks:

- Lean rails and handrails are being delivered at the end of February, and will be installed around the Raised Grove.
- Continuation of the work to install the new Dartmouth Street sidewalk area.
- As weather allows, installation of the pervious brick pavers in the NW corner of the site.
