AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND GRANT FUNDS AWARDED BY THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS FOR PRELIMINARY DESIGN, TECHNICAL ANALYSIS, AND PRE-PERMITTING FOR PROPOSED CLIMATE RESILIENT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TO JOSEPH MOAKLEY PARK.

ORDERED: That the City of Boston, acting by and through its Commissioner of the Parks and Recreation Department, be, and hereby is, authorized pursuant to Section 53A of Chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws to accept and expend a Municipal Vulnerability Preparedness Program Action Grant from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EOEEA), in an amount that shall not exceed One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00), for the purpose of providing preliminary design, technical analysis, and pre-permitting for proposed climate resilient capital improvements to Joseph Moakley Park located in the neighborhood of South Boston.
